Where can we turn?

There seems to be more and more uncertainty and instability in our world, and we seem to lurch from one crisis to the next with no respite. Many of us are struggling with the constant uncertainty and the persistent rumours which suggest to us that everything will get worse, not better. So, what can we do?

For a start, maybe we need to take more control over which story we are listening to the most. Is it the negative story of the media or the story a particular political party is proclaiming? I read this in a book today, "The story of God should get more of your attention time than any other media." This makes sense because it matters which story we allow to shape our thinking.

Ephesians 1:20-21 says that Jesus is now "in the place of honour at God's right hand in the heavenly realms... far above any ruler or authority or power or leader or anything else—not only in this world but also in the world to come." Jesus is the ruler of the world. This doesn't mean that everything that happens in the world is as God wants it to be – far from it – but it does mean that we have hope for the future, no matter how difficult the present seems.

Here is a quote from a reflection on Psalm 23 to hang on to at this time: "My reality is not determined by pandemics, politics, or anything else. I live in God; He lives in me. His goodness is with me today, and my future is wonderful." Hope you find it helpful. Blessings to you all, Sonya
