

The season we are in now has been referred to often by the media as the 'new normal.' But what is this 'new normal' and how can we live as faithful followers of Jesus at this time? At a webinar I was at the other day it was suggested that uncertainty is the new normal! It is certainly true that you never quite know



what you are going to hear when you switch on the news, but it is rarely good news.

Over the next few weeks, we are going to be exploring the book of Nehemiah on Sunday mornings. Nehemiah was a good leader who returned from exile in order to help accomplish the rebuilding of the city walls of Jerusalem. The walls were broken down which meant that the people had no security. This was a difficult time for the people of God. In the book of Nehemiah, we encounter real people in disastrous circumstances, where people are killed, as well as in happy situations, where people have the joy of returning to the homeland of their forefathers. Sorrow, joy, and hope filled people's lives as they endured this difficult period in the history of Israel.

There are many lessons which we can learn from Nehemiah about how to serve God and others during difficult times and when facing huge challenges. Why not come along on Sundays as we explore together what God has to say to us through the book of Nehemiah? I think we'll be glad we did.
